Trainers Edge	<i>While the Trainer's EDGE is a required train-the-trainer course for Wood Badge and NYLT staffs, it is also for other trainers wishing to enhance their training and presentation skills. It is meant to supplement the practice offered through Wood Badge and NYLT staff development, with a focus on the participant, while raising the level of skill a trainer brings to the staff experience. Only practice can polish these skills, but this course is intended to "train the trainer" on behaviors and resources while offering hands-on experience in methods and media.</i>	
	<i>Participants will need to bring a 10-12 minute presentation that you will give in a small group. It can be on any scout-appropriate topic. Bring everything you need to give the presentation. This is an essential part of the course. You will receive feedback on your presentation.</i>	10-4
Cub Master/BALOO - Scoutmaster/IOLS	<i>Get specific training for the Cub Master and the Scoutmaster positions and also learn about the training components of BALOO and IOLS necessary to complete the specific leader training</i>	9-4

Mental Health First Aid	<i>Just as CPR helps you assist an individual having a heart attack, Mental Health First Aid helps you assist someone experiencing a mental health or substance use-related crisis. In the Mental Health First Aid course, you learn risk factors and warning signs for mental health and addiction concerns, strategies for how to help someone in both crisis and non-crisis situations, and where to turn for help.</i>	
	<i>Mental Health First Aid also teaches about recovery and resiliency – the belief that individuals experiencing these challenges can and do get better, and use their strengths to stay well.</i>
